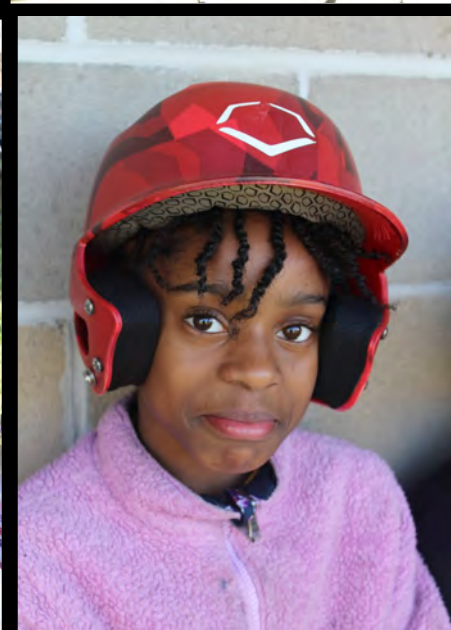


# PITCH IN FOR BASEBALL & SOFTBALL

**As we reflect on another year, we can't help but feel grateful for your continued support.** Pitch In For Baseball & Softball believes that baseball and softball are more than just games— they have the power to change lives. It is the generosity of the community, donors, and partners who support PIFBS that enables us to change the lives of children through baseball and softball.

In 2019, PIFBS had the honor of continuing our work with industry leaders (MLB, Little League, Wilson Sporting Goods), MLB club teams (Reds, Twins, Dodgers, Mets, Yankees), organizations, and foundations who care about spreading the joy of baseball and softball to kids in underserved communities. One of our existing partners, the Tull Family Foundation, teamed up with a first-time partner of ours, the Pirates, to bring baseball and softball to kids in **Pittsburgh. PIFBS also worked with the A's to get equipment to kids in Oakland and we returned to Puerto Rico** to continue our disaster relief efforts with partners Rushmore Loan Management and Auction.com. As an organization, we have undergone a leadership change, promoting a new CEO and hiring two new employees in 2019.

We are supported by kids, leagues, and companies across the country who care deeply about spreading the joy of baseball and softball and conduct equipment collections and fundraisers on our behalf. Collected equipment is given new life in the hands of a child who has never had their own glove before. Kids from as far away as Arizona choose PIFBS as their charitable partner so they can help other kids play ball just like they do. Fundraising efforts enable us **to fill in the gaps whenever we do not have enough gear in our warehouse. Our work wouldn't be possible without this** support.

As you will see in the pages that follow, we have many stories and photos to share which highlight the impact of our work this year. We hope you enjoy learning more about the incredible difference your support is making in the lives of children around the world. Thank you for helping to make the work we do possible.

Pitch In For Baseball & Softball® is a registered 501(c)(3), not for profit organization that helps give the gift of play and contributes to positive youth development by providing equipment to children around the world. PIFBS reduces barriers to play and promotes youth development by providing equipment directly to leagues, schools, and organizations around the world to start, continue, and/or expand their programs. Over the past 14+ years, Pitch In For Baseball & Softball has helped over 900,000 kids in every state in the U.S. and 100 countries.

**Domestic and International Equipment Grants**—These grants are designed to help leagues, teams, and community organizations around the globe get the proper equipment to play baseball and softball. Grantees complete required annual reporting detailing the impact of the donation. Our strategic partnerships help us reach the most under-resourced communities around the world. PIFBS averages 600 projects each year.

**School Based Program**—Launched in 2008, our School Based Program helps schools/districts stretch limited budgets, reduce participation fees, and shift funds to other areas such as transportation. PIFBS is implementing School Based Programs in Philadelphia, Northern Kentucky, Minneapolis/St. Paul, Chicago, and the Bronx.

**Disaster Relief Program**—In times of tragedy, children are the most affected. Baseball and softball can help to restore a sense of normalcy amidst the chaos. PIFBS has rebuilt entire leagues and helped thousands of kids start their season on time. PIFBS has assisted with relief efforts on the NY/NJ shoreline following Hurricane Sandy; Joplin, MO; the Gulf Coast region; Japan; Houston; Puerto Rico; and more.

**Youth Service Learning**—Whether for school service learning, Bar/Bat mitzvahs, Eagle Scouts, or for fun, nearly 200 kids choose PIFBS each year as their charitable partner. About 60% of the equipment PIFBS gives away each year comes from the efforts of motivated, caring kids who run collections and fundraise on PIFBS' behalf.

## DOMESTIC & INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

Through our general equipment grant application process, Pitch In For Baseball & Softball distributes new and gently used gear to groups throughout the United States to help increase youth participation in baseball/softball. PIFBS strives to make the sport accessible to all kids regardless of financial means. Through our international equipment grant application process, PIFBS gets gear to groups outside of the United States where interest in baseball/softball is **growing rapidly**. In many countries, baseball and softball equipment is very expensive or isn't available to purchase at all so PIFBS is their means for starting their program. PIFBS fulfills all equipment grant requests that we receive from eligible applicants.

Our strategic partners such as Little League and Major League Baseball's Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBI) program help ensure that we are reaching the most under-resourced communities and enable us to send gear abroad in a cost-effective manner.



The 2019 season was an incredible bonding experience for all of the boys on the Isaac Middle School baseball team out of Phoenix, Arizona. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade boys on the team admired their 8<sup>th</sup> grade teammates so much that they shared their desire to be role models to the younger players on the team next year. As a whole, the team recognized their impact on their **fellow classmates, adhered to the school's behavioral expectations, and** strived for academic success throughout the season and beyond. Due to their continued academic success, the head coach entered them into the Phoenix City Baseball Championship tournament and the team won 1st place and ended their season on a high note!



In 2017 and 2019, Pitch In For Baseball & Softball sent an entire container of baseball and softball gear to the Philippines. Though softball is not a mainstream sport in the Philippines, it has grown drastically, and children who excel at the sport are given additional opportunities for education within the country. Former players volunteer their time to help the next **generation improve**. PIFBS' donation enabled the group, 1 United Philippine Softball to create three additional teams in 2019 and provide over 750 kids the opportunity to play softball. This was a dramatic increase over their 2018 participation numbers.





At age 13, Alon immigrated from the United States to Israel. Due to the lack of popularity of the sport in Israel, basic baseball equipment such as bats, balls, gloves, and helmets are often difficult for teams to acquire. Alon was thrilled when Israel Association of Baseball was the recipient of an equipment grant from PIFBS and he was able to utilize quality baseball equipment from the United States. Alon's talent was identified quickly and he was able to participate on the 14U Israel National Team.



In 2018, Pitch In For Baseball & Softball lost one of its long-time board members, Dave Davis. In coordination with Dave's wife, PIFBS completed a project in 2019 with Horsham Challenger Little League to honor our dear friend Dave. Dave loved the game and was a passionate San Francisco Giants fan, even spending a month in Arizona for spring training.

The Horsham Challenger Division welcomes players of all ages, who have physical and intellectual challenges, to enjoy the game of baseball along with their peers. Director of Operations & Programs, Steve Bizon, was able to deliver the donation to the league's pizza party in November. The program was thrilled with the donation that included batting helmets, bats, gloves, apparel items, equipment bags, baseballs, and more! In total, the donation was valued at over \$7,000.



Members of the Philadelphia Adult League Softball (PALS) team took a trip to Belize in the summer of 2019 to run softball clinics and provide equipment to boys and girls. In Belize, softball for both boys and girls continues to be more accessible. PIFBS was able to provide over \$2,000 worth of equipment for PALS to take along with them to Belize. In addition to clinic participants receiving equipment, eight primary schools received gear to start or expand their softball programs as part of the physical education program. Two young boys who participated in the clinic, Mark\* and John\*, decided to try out for the Belize Junior National Team. The president of the Belize City Softball Association credits their participation and receipt of a pair of cleats from the clinics with helping to give them the confidence to try out for the team.

# SCHOOL BASED PROGRAMS

Pitch In For Baseball & Softball's School Based Program helps schools and districts in under-resourced communities start, continue, or expand their baseball and softball programs and stretch limited budgets. Starting in 2008 within the Philadelphia School District, PIFBS began helping children not only get on the field, but also increase their attendance and GPA as a result of playing ball. Many kids joining our programs have never played baseball or softball before, adding increased awareness around both sports. In 2019, five cities across the country participated in our School Based Program and PIFBS hopes to continue this success in 2020.

When Johnathan arrived at the first baseball meeting held by the coaches during the school year, he had never picked up a ball or glove before. His high school, Henry Senior High, was one of the recipients of an equipment grant from PIFBS that was generously funded by the Minnesota Twins. Because Henry High School received an equipment grant, Johnathan was able to receive his very first glove for the upcoming season! He worked extremely hard throughout the season to learn the game and was chosen as the Most Improved Player by his coaches and teammates.



After witnessing Zaniya's exceptional skill in a hockey unit during physical education class, the head softball coach at AMY Northwest High School knew she could transfer those skills to being a catcher. Though Zaniya had only previously only run on the track team, she decided to give softball a try. Zaniya became the team's full time catcher as she quickly picked up the sport and grew to love it. She was grateful to meet new friends while experiencing a new sport and is looking forward to playing on the team again next year!

## PARTNER PROGRAMS

Pitch In For Baseball & Softball is proud to work with industry leaders who have enabled us to expand our programming and help more children around the world. These partners are instrumental in allowing us to grow our impact by making generous financial contributions, giving large donations of in-kind product, and connecting us to groups in need of assistance.

Pictured above, a group of equipment grant recipients in Puerto Rico. PIFBS returned to Puerto Rico in 2019 to support additional teams impacted by the hurricanes. Auction.com provided four Little League softball teams in Puerto Rico with nearly \$12,000 worth of brand new equipment to replace all the gear that was lost in the storm.



The Pittsburgh Pirates and the Tull Family Foundation teamed up with PIFBS to help over 1,300 kids get on the field in the Pittsburgh area this year! Though PIFBS has worked with the Tull Family Foundation previously, it was our first time teaming up with the Pirates. The donation included **gloves, catcher's gear, helmets, bats, baseballs/softballs, equipment bags, cleats, and batting tees** valued at more than \$75,000. The donation supported both baseball and softball teams from Little Leagues, schools, and other organizations in the Pittsburgh area.







Pitch In For Baseball & Softball was grateful to partner with the New York Mets again in 2019 to help kids get the proper gear to play ball. This year's program supported 50 baseball teams and 50 softball teams in the five boroughs of Manhattan and Long Island who participate in the Mets' Sandlot Stars Program. To celebrate the donation, the Mets hosted a distribution event at Citi Field and invited the teams, coaches, and parents to the ballpark to pick up their equipment and enjoy a fun-filled afternoon. Thank you, Mets!



Longtime partner Wilson Sporting Goods teamed up with us again in 2019 for the second year of a Pitch In For Softball Signature Project in their backyard of Chicago, IL. Wilson generously donated all of the equipment for this project – valued at over \$30,000 – which included softballs, catcher's gear, helmets, bats, gloves, and a team bag. In addition, each Chicago Public School team received apparel items that were generously donated to PIFBS by Under Armour. Wilson hosted some of the schools at their Chicago headquarters to pick up their equipment and also had some of their employees speak to the students about their journey to working at Wilson and what their jobs entail. Special thanks to our friends at Wilson for making this project a possibility again this year and for their commitment to helping kids in Chicago and around the world play ball!

The New York Yankees and the Matsui 55 Foundation (former Yankee Hideki Matsui's nonprofit organization) partnered with Pitch In For Baseball & Softball to get 22 teams in the Bronx some brand new equipment to start their season. In total, the donation was valued at over \$48,000. Thanks to the support of the Yankees and Matsui 55 Foundation, over 400 kids in the Bronx will have a chance to play ball this year with new, safe equipment!







Rushmore Loan Management again supported several disaster relief programs with Pitch In For Baseball & Softball in 2019. The first project directed disaster relief funds to 13 Little League teams in Puerto Rico where baseball and softball are deeply engrained in the fabric of Puerto Rican culture. The island, still reeling from the devastation of the 2017 hurricanes, has been excited to get back to the games they love. In total, the donation was valued at nearly \$14,000 and helped over 250 children get brand new gear to take the field in the spring.

In 2018, California had the worst wildfire season ever recorded. In particular, the town of Paradise, CA saw extreme destruction and devastation. Rushmore supported over 1,000 children that participate in Paradise Little League Baseball and Little League Softball by providing over \$12,000 worth of brand new equipment to the leagues. The equipment replaced all that was lost in the 2018 fire and ensured that the local community could restore a sense of normalcy for children and families by getting back to baseball and softball in the spring.

**Pitch In For Baseball & Softball serves as Major League Baseball's exclusive** equipment partner to help their RBI (Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities) program grow and increase participation across the United States. In 2019, Pitch In For Baseball & Softball helped MLB get equipment to 225 RBI teams in 51 cities across the country which gave over 3,700 kids all over the United States a chance to play ball.

For Bobby\*, age 11, baseball provided a sense of belonging. His challenges in school and social environments were leading to him getting into trouble. This year, baseball became an outlet for Bobby when he received a glove that he could call his own for the very first time. His glove gave him a sense of ownership and confidence on the field. Participating in Baseball Beyond Borders provided Bobby a safe space to learn, fail, grow, and make friends and memories to last a lifetime.

The Minnesota Twins continued their School Based Program in the Twin cities for the fifth consecutive year and PIFBS was thrilled to partner with them again! This 2019 program consisted of 55 team kits for baseball and softball programs from Minneapolis and St. Paul. The Twins generously hosted the teams for a distribution event at Target Field in March where they got to pick up their gear and meet PIFBS Board Chairman and former Twin, Roy Smalley. Over 4,000 pieces of brand-new equipment valued at nearly \$100,000 will be supporting over 900 kids in the Minneapolis and St. Paul areas, enabling them to get on the field with safe, usable equipment. Thank you, Twins!





For three years, Pitch In For Baseball & Softball has joined the Cincinnati Reds and St. Elizabeth Healthcare in delivering a program in the greater Cincinnati area and northern Kentucky. This year was no exception and got PIFBS' 2019 program year off to a great start by providing 55 teams with baseball and softball equipment valued at over \$42,000. The Reds and St. Elizabeth hosted a distribution event for the teams to come out and pick up their gear and hear from representatives of PIFBS, the Reds, and St. Elizabeth. The Reds had their mascot and pitcher Sal Romano join in on the fun and mingle with the students. Over 850 students in the Cincinnati area benefitted from this donation of brand new equipment thanks to the generosity of the Reds and St. Elizabeth!



PIFBS and the Milwaukee Brewers partnered in 2019 to help grow the Brewers' RBI program. The donation, valued at over \$13,000, included baseball and softball equipment for the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Milwaukee, Journey Inc., and Beckum-Stapleton Little League. Equipment included gloves, catcher's gear, baseballs, softballs, helmets, bats, team bags, and more! In total, over 2,000 children across all of the programs benefitted from the donation of brand new gear.



Pitch In For Baseball & Softball has been working with Mauricio Dubon since he was in the MiLB. Now a middle infielder with the San Francisco Giants, Mauricio's commitment to helping kids in his home country of Honduras has not waived. In Honduras, baseball equipment is difficult to come by due to the popularity of soccer. In 2019, PIFBS was able to help provide equipment to over 100 children who participate in Liga Roberto Valenzuela Little League. Mauricio traveled to Honduras to deliver the equipment and spend time talking with and coaching the children.





## DONOR HIGHLIGHTS

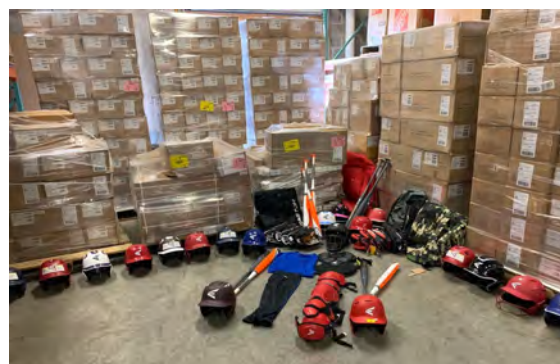
About 60% of the equipment that PIFBS has available to distribute comes from caring kids, teams, and companies across the country who want to give others a chance to play baseball and softball. Donations of equipment help to keep our costs low and enable us to support more teams each year. PIFBS can accept any piece of baseball or softball equipment that is in safe, playable condition, however the gear we need the most are:

- Gloves (12"+)
- Baseballs/softballs
- BBCOR/USA stamped bats
- Catcher's equipment
- Softball equipment

Pictured above left are volunteers from PIFBS' annual equipment collection day at Citizens Bank Park. The general public attending the game can bring equipment to drop in collection bins outside the entrances to the ballpark. In 2019, PIFBS collected over 100 pieces of equipment!

Our friends at Little League International sent us two generous donations in 2019: a large donation of helmets, pictured above right, and another donation of pants! In addition to these donations,, Little League generously appeals to their leagues across the country to clean out their storage sheds and send any unneeded gear to PIFBS!

Despite living nearly 3,000 miles away from our Pennsylvania warehouse location, collecting equipment to donate to Pitch In For Baseball & Softball quickly became a family tradition for the California-based Shcharber Family. Over the span of seven years, both Michael and Jake have collected gear to donate to Pitch In For Baseball & Softball. The Shcharber family has been able to ship all of their collected equipment each year to our Los Angeles warehouse location. The PIFBS staff was fortunate enough to meet the entire Shcharber family in 2019 while they were vacationing on the east coast. They were able to make a pit-stop to our warehouse to meet everyone and receive a tour of our main operation. Thank you Shcharber family for your continued support!



Pitch In For Baseball & Softball is very grateful to Easton Sporting Goods for their large scale donation of baseball and softball equipment! PIFBS received over 10 pallets of equipment from Easton! The donation of over 4,000 pieces of gear will help hundreds of kids get some brand new gear to take the field.

In addition to a generous donation of equipment, Easton hosted a Future of Baseball Social Media Summit as part of launching the organization's first annual **Team Easton Experience**. The biggest baseball influencers and content creators in social media came together for a day of behind the scenes experiences at Easton and some friendly baseball competitions to raise money for two nonprofits. PIFBS was ecstatic to find out we were one of the nonprofit recipients of this awesome event!







Arizona native and avid baseball player, Easton, knew that running an equipment collection drive would be a perfect fit for his upcoming Eagle Scout project. PIFBS is fortunate that Easton chose to collect gear to be donated to us! 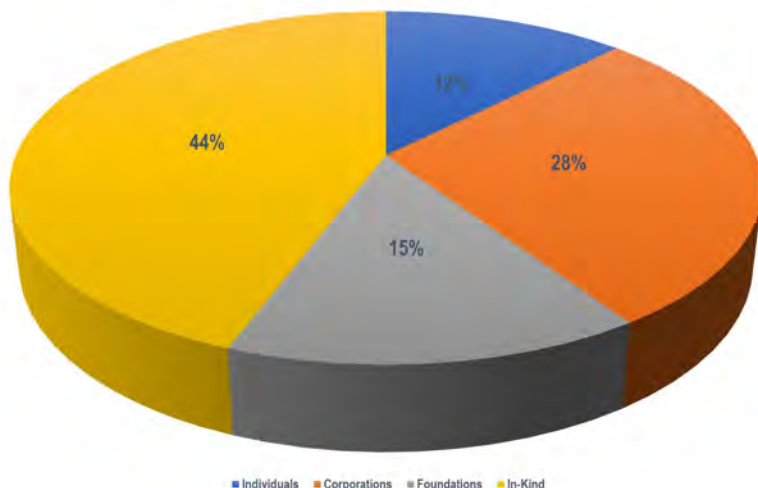

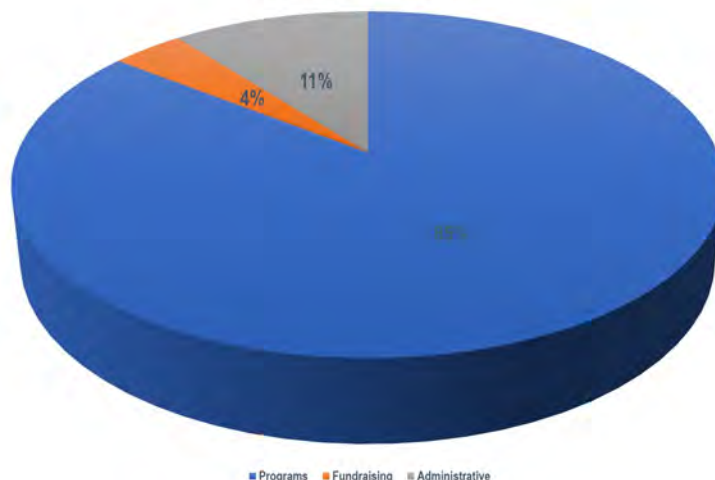
